Masters of Horror is an anthology television series created by director Mick Garris for the Showtime cable network.

Origin [edit #128068;]

In 2002, director Mick Garris invited some director friends to an informal dinner at a restaurant in Sherman Oaks, California. #128068; The original ten "masters" attending were John Carpenter, Larry Cohen, Don Coscarelli, Joe Dante, Guillermo del Toro, Stuart Gordon, Tobe #128068; Hooper, John Landis, Bill Malone, and Garris himself.

Subsequently, Garris organized regular dinners with the group and invited other horror and #128068; other genre directors to attend, including Dario Argento, Eli Roth, Wes Craven, David Cronenberg, Tim Sullivan, Rob Zombie, Bryan Singer, #128068; Fred Dekker, William Lustig, Lucky McKee, Ernest Dickerson, Katt Shea, Quentin Tarantino, Robert Rodriguez, James Gunn, Mary Lambert, Tom Holland, #128068; Peter Medak, Ti West, Lloyd Kaufman, and others. In 2005, Garris created and produced an original anthology television series of #128068; one-hour movies, written and directed by many of the "masters," which was originally broadcast in the U.S. on the Showtime #128068; cable network. In several international territories, the films were released theatrically.

The series debuted to excellent reviews in the U.S. on #128068; October 28, 2005, with the premiere episode "Incident On and Off a Mountain Road" so written and directed by Don Coscarelli. #128068; based on the short
